Applying for the course

Familiarity with the technique is essential, either through attendance at one of our seminars, study with a CMVT, or participation in a group conducted by a CMVT. We require a bachelor's or equivalent degree in voice, music education, speech, or a related field, although significant professional experience may also be considered.

The application consists of official degree transcripts, a letter of recommendation from a CMVT, and the application form, available at www.mcclosky.org.

Applications should be complete by April 15,

or earlier if you wish to begin the online classes before that date.
